

New Indian Footwear Requirements

- In October 2020, India's Ministry of Commerce and Industry approved 3 footwear orders:
 - PPE footwear
 - Footwear made from leather and other materials
 - Footwear made from rubber and polymeric materials
- The Orders require footwear to comply with mandatory Indian Standards
- Compliant footwear must bear the BIS Standard Mark and the manufacturer's license number
- These requirements take force 1 July 2021
- AAFA and the US-India Business Council sent a letter to BIS requesting an extension to the date of enforcement and the ability for international labs to conduct tests




Mexico Considers Textile Labeling Amendments

- Mexico's Ministry of the Economy notified the WTO of a Draft Mexican Official Standard PROY-NOM-004-SE-2020, Commercial information - Labelling of textile products, articles of apparel, clothing accessories and household linen
- The draft would cancel NOM-004-SCFI-2006
- The draft updates the references fiber identity standards to NMX-A-2076-INNTEX-2013 and NMX-A-6938-INNTEX-2013

Treated Articles in Canada

- Health Canada updated its "Information Note" on treated articles
- The Note provides guidance to manufacturers, distributors and importers of articles that have been treated with antimicrobial preservatives
 - For instance, insecticide-treated clothing that acts as a delivery mechanism for the insecticide
- The Note answers the question, "Does my registered treated article require a Pest Control Product number on the product?"
 - The answer is "Yes"!
- The Note also authorizes the display of registration numbers on hangtags for insecticide-treated clothing



EPR for Textiles in France & Netherlands

- In 2007, per France's Environmental Code, anyone presenting new textiles in the French market is responsible for recycling or disposal of their products
- Companies can accomplish this by:
 - Contracting with Refashion, the accredited eco-organization, or
 - Setting-up an individual take-back program
- Refashion has advised that the use of the Triman mark is appropriate for textiles
- Last week, the Dutch State Secretary Van Veldhoven announced she will introduce extended product responsibility (UPV) for textiles in 2023



Amended Indonesian Labeling Requirements

- On 1 April 2021, the Indonesian Ministry of Trade approved a Regulation on the mandatory labeling of goods in the Indonesian language (Bahasa)
- Labeling is required on products, their packaging, or both
- Required information includes:
 - Product identity;
 - Manufacturer/ importer identity and
 - Country of origin
- These requirements apply to imported or domestically-produced products, including textiles
- The Regulation entered into force on 1 May 2021

Russian Extends Transition for 'Honest Sign' for Footwear

- Since 2019, the Russian Federation has required several product types to be registered in the Chestny ZNAK (“Honest Sign”) track and trace system
 - Fur products,
 - Textiles (light industry” products) and
 - Footwear
- In April, Russia extended the transitional period for footwear products
 - Retailers may transport and store footwear belonging to them, in their possession and/ or use through 1 July 2020
 - All codes for this remaining stock will need to be put into circulation no later than 15 June 2021



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Argentina Delays Implementation of DJCP

- Argentina's Resolution No. 246/2018 requires manufacturers and importers of textile products and footwear to submit to a Sworn Statement of Product Composition (DJCP)
- The DJCP should include details of the test report, including, but not limited to:
 - Name and address of applicant or laboratory;
 - Date of issue of the report;
 - Identification of the sample;
 - Test method used stating of the technical standard used to measure against;
 - Individual and average percentage values of each component, for textiles; and
 - The material constituting the majority of each of the parts, for footwear
- The Argentine Ministry of Productive Development has extended implementation of these requirements several times due to COVID-19, most recently in March 2021


